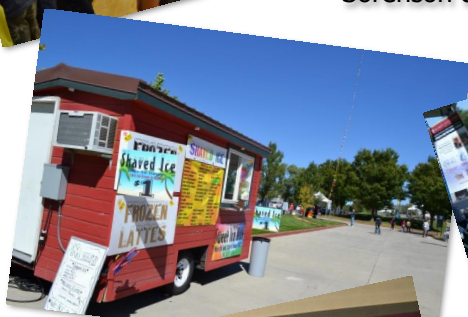

Obituaries

September 18, 2013 – Walter Jastremsky, who worked at the Utah School for the Deaf from 1959 through the 1960s, passed away in Boise ID. After moving to Boise, he worked in the Boise Cascade print shop for 26 years. . Many of his finest achievements came from his volunteer roles and leadership in the Idaho Deaf community. He served for nineteen years on the Idaho Council for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, a Governor-appointed position, where he advocated for deaf education and testified to the State Board of Education. Among other contributions, he was involved in enacting the Americans with Disabilities Act in Idaho in 1991 and in getting a TTY installed at the Boise airport. In 2012, Walter was selected for the Hamilton Relay Deaf Community Leader Award for Idaho. Funeral services and burial took place in Boise. His wife, Diane Stanford, whom Walter met while working at USD, survives him.

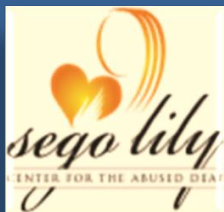
Cycling Heroes Success!
