### Wheeler Scholarships Available for 2014-2015 School Year

The Ned C. Wheeler Scholarship Foundation for the Deaf is pleased to announce that two scholarships of \$1,000 each are available this spring for the 2014-2015 academic year, with a deadline of July 31 to apply.

The organization has awarded scholarships to deserving deaf students in colleges and universities for more than 30 years. Awards are given based on student grades, financial need, and maintaining a full time status.

Criteria for qualifying includes three years residency in Utah, GPA of 3.0 or higher, proof of deafness, and more.

Eligible candidates for the scholarships need to apply now and gather up all required documentation to be sent in well before the deadline.




### Interpreted Plays at the Utah Shakespeare Festival!

### Deaf Parent Infant Program (Paula Pittman)

The Parent Infant Program was able to implement a new pilot project, called Listening Time, in January, 2014. We had originally hoped to begin the program last October, but we had some logistical challenges that prevented us from beginning until January. This project provides listening skills training to children and families in our program and is open to any child over the age of 18 months who is wearing his or her listening device all waking hours and whose family is committed to helping their child use their residual hearing to the best of their ability, regardless of the communication approach or approaches the family is using to interact with their child. We currently have 8 children involved in this program, and hope to continue it next year. We look forward to gathering progress data on the children and will be gathering information from families to determine their satisfaction from the service to determine if the project should be sustainable.

We are looking forward to sponsoring a Parent Retreat in conjunction with the Blind PIP Program for all of the families in Deaf or Blind PIP on Friday evening, March 21 and all day Saturday, March 22 at the Robert Sanderson Community Center for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing. We are so grateful to the Deaf Center for their continued support of PIP! We hosted a Parent Retreat last year for our families, which was rated as one of the best events we offered last year. We hope families will be equally satisfied with the Parent Retreat this year. Our theme this year is "A License to Chill", and we will be helping families explore ways they can take care of themselves first so they have enough energy to take care of their child who is deaf or hard of hearing. This is the only event we have all year that is a 'parents only' activity. We have a variety of speakers who will be presenting on a variety of topics that will be of interest to families.

We are still looking for an ASL/English Orientation Specialist and we are looking forward to hiring a new Deaf Mentor, so if anyone is interested in working in PIP in either of these capacities, please consider joining our team. We have more fun things planned for the Summer, so stay tuned to hear about what will be doing in the months to come!
